SWANA-Georgia Chapter is proud to announce it will host the 2011 SWANA International Road-E-O at the Southern Pines Ag & Expo Center in the Southern Pines Recreational Complex in Dublin, GA. It's an incredible venue, offering sufficient room to conduct truck driver, equipment operator and mechanic competitions at the same location -- allowing participants, judges and spectators an opportunity to mingle with "the other half" of the business.

The heart of Georgia . . .

Dublin is located mid-State, with all the state's major cities within about a two hour drive. It is 125 miles from Atlanta, 120 miles from Savannah, 50 miles from Macon, 100 miles from Augusta, and 120 miles from Athens and Albany.

Something for everyone. . . .

Dublin boasts a mild climate year-round, as well as an environment suitable for tennis, golf, fishing or hunting. Visitors can choose to engage in a variety of local recreation and entertainment opportunities including: Theatre Dublin, Market on Madison, the Dublin-Laurens Museum, the Heritage Center of the Laurens County Library, the Hugh Gillis Public Fishing Area, the Oconee River, Southern Pines Regional Park, and three area golf courses. Milledgeville, 45 miles to the north, is the former Capital of Georgia. It's historic district includes a restored Governor's Mansion and the former farm of Flannery O'Conner, a famed Southern writer. Nearby Macon is home to the Georgia Music Hall of Fame and the Georgia Sports Hall of Fame. Macon is also home to the Ocmulgee National Monument, an area that includes remnants of an ancient village that dates back to 900AD and 1200AD with a temple, burial grounds, prehistoric ditches, and a ceremonial earth lodge.
